Qualifying rounds for most NPS competitions are open to ponies owned by NPS members and non-members but only ponies owned by adult NPS Qualifying or Life members are eligible to qualify for the final of the competition at the NPS Summer Championship Show at Malvern from 1st-3rd August 2023.

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS: Would all exhibitors please note:

- 1. Organisers reserve the right to amalgamate, cancel or split classes as necessary.
- 2. Sherborne Castle Country Fair and Rare Breeds Show will not be responsible for any illness or accident that may occur to any animal or article exhibited at the Show. It shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the group harmless and indemnify it against any legal proceedings arising from any such accident or illness. All exhibitors must have the correct insurance for showing stock.
- 3. Animals must be the property of the exhibitor for 3 months at the time of the show.
- 4. Animals in poor health or suffering from any form of contagious or infectious disease must not be brought to the show. Animals sent for exhibition may at any time, on the instruction of the Judges, Director, Secretary, Stewards or Officials of the Show, be inspected by the Veterinary officer of the Show. The Veterinary Officer will be instructed to order the removal from the show ground of any animal which in his opinion is affected by a disease or condition likely to prove harmful to other animals or is any way unfit for exhibition.
- 4a All equines (horses, ponies, donkeys) attending the Sherborne Show must have been vaccinated for Equine Influenza. Equines may attend having received the primary course, and prior to the first booster, but not within 7 days of receiving a vaccine dose. The primary course is 1st vaccination and then 2nd vaccination 21 92 days later. This should be followed by the first booster (150 215 days) and all subsequent boosters. Equines must have been vaccinated within the 6 months prior to the Show. Foals In-foal mares that have already had vaccinations of primary Equine Influenza course should be vaccinated 4-6 weeks before the foal is due to be born. Foals should be vaccinated for Equine Influenza at 6 months to commence their primary course.

Equine Passports - Must accompany all equines arriving at the Showground. Random checks may be carried out

- 5. Persons making an entry and not sending their proposed exhibit to the show shall forfeit their entrance fee
- 6. Exhibitor numbers must be conspicuously fixed to each handler before they will be allowed to enter the show ring.

- 7. No unauthorised person allowed into the show ring whilst judging is in progress.
- 8. The decisions of the Judge shall be final in all cases
- 9. All livestock must be presented for judging at the time announced for their respective class
- 10. Exhibitors of stock must provide proper chains, halters, head collars, food and water. Cattle must be double tied in the lines.
- 11. All animals are to be led in the show ring. **Exhibitors must ensure they provide sufficient handlers.**
- 12. No exhibitor may smoke in the show ring
- 13. In all classes a white coat must be worn by the handler, except for horse and pony classes.
- 14. Animals must be registered or eligible for registration in a Herd/Stud/Flock Book of their breed or in the Combined Flock Book
- 15. No animal may be left unattended on the show ground. If an exhibitor wishes to leave the show ground for any reason the section secretary must be informed and someone must be left on the show ground to be responsible for the exhibitors stock. Failure to comply with this regulation will result in a £50 fine.
- 16. Any complaint must be made in writing to the Show Secretary within half an hour of the judging of the class. A deposit of £20 will be required for each complaint
- 17. **Exhibitors must provide a valid mobile phone number on their entry form.** This will be only used for contact on Show Day or in case of cancellation or abandonment of the Show.
- 18. All animals to meet identification requirements as required by DEFRA. Animals without adequate ear tags will be refused entry to the show.
- 19.Livestock must be supervised at all times by a person over 16 years of age and experienced in the handling of such animals. Any handler under 16 years of age must be supervised by a responsible adult while showing their stock. No boars or rams to be shown by children under 9

20. Animals must not be removed before 4.30pm

21. Entries accepted after the closing date will incur a £5 fee per exhibitor and may not appear in the catalogue. Cheques returned unpaid by our bank will attract a surcharge of £10 Fees must then be paid by cash on the day of the show.

22. GENERAL DATA PROTECTION REGULATIONS – PRIVACY NOTICE

The Sherborne Castle Country Fair and Rare Breeds Show take care to protect personal information and hold only the minimum necessary for the purpose of contacting you about supporting and attending our fair which, under the General Data Protection Regulations, is permitted as a task carried out in the public interest. We do not share your personal

information with any other company or organization. Personal data that we hold is confined to names, addresses, telephone numbers and email addresses, as well as some historical data on previous involvement Any paper copies are held for limited periods only. Computer entries are reviewed at least annually and erased if lapsed or no longer relevant. Data on paper is destroyed securely after use.

ENGLISH GOAT BREEDERS ASSOCIATION RULES

- 28. Any goat in milk needs to be milked out as far as possible on the morning of the show and should not be travelled or be shown with an overstocked udder. The judge will reserve the right to ask for a goat to be milked out if thought necessary.
- 29. All male goats must be entire.

NATIONAL PONY SOCIETY RULES

- 23. NPS Qualifying Rounds: These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS. Ponies must be registered in any of the British Riding Pony studbook sections or the Ridden Register; the GSB; the AHSB; the AASB, or registered in the main body of their respective M&M Stud Book. Part breds are not eligible unless overstamped into one of the British Riding Pony studbook sections. or the Ridden Register. Qualifying rounds for most NPS competitions are open to ponies owned by NPS members and non members but only ponies owned by adult NPS Qualifying or Life members are eligible to qualify for the final of the competition at the NPS Summer Championship Show at Malvern from 1st 3rd August 2023. The highest placed pony, if owned by an NPS member, in each class will qualify for the final. Qualification may pass down to third place if the first and second ponies are already qualified.
- 24. The NPS/NIART STUD M&M In Hand Summer Championship (MM-IH) These classes are open to pure bred registered M&M ponies in the main body of their studbook. Owner's membership cards must be shown in the ring to receive qualifications. Foals are not eligible.

25. The NPS/MOLE VALLEY FARMERS M&M Home Produced In Hand National Championship (MM-HPIH)

These classes are open to pure bred registered M&M ponies which are either stabled at home or in a DIY yard and which since 1st January in the current year have not been shown by a producer or stabled in a producer's yard other than on a DIY basis or at stud. To be owned/kept, produced, ridden/handled by a person who does not derive their main income from working with horses/ponies. No professional producers are allowed into the ring to groom/strip the horse/pony. Please see NPS Rule Book, Sec A, 3.6. Please enter this class in the spirit it is intended. Competitors who contravene the above will be disqualified.

26. NPS SILVER MEDAL ROSETTE CHAMPIONSHIPS: These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS. NPS Silver Medal Rosettes are only awarded when the owner of the champion pony is a Qualifying or Life member of the NPS. A valid membership card must be in the rider's/handler's possession on entering the ring and be produced immediately on request by either the judge or the steward. If the owner of the Champion pony is not a member, or the owner's membership card is not immediately produced, the rosette may be

awarded to the Reserve Champion provided they have the required membership card. If the Champion pony has previously qualified it is still entitled to the Silver Medal Rosette, but the qualification card goes to the Reserve Champion pony, provided the owner of that pony is a member of the NPS. The Silver Medal Rosette and the qualification card can be awarded no lower than first Reserve (third). Foals are not eligible for Silver Medal Championships Qualifiers are entitled to compete in the final of the Silver Medal Rosette Championship to be held at the NPS Summer Championship Show 1-3 August 2023.

27. NPS/ BLACKERTOR & SHARPTOR STUDS M&M In Hand Silver Medal Rosette Championship (SM-MMIH)

A Silver Medal Rosette is offered by the National Pony Society for the best registered pony owned by an NPS Qualifying or Life member in the M&M In Hand section. The Sponsor's Rosette is also awarded to the pony receiving the qualification. Membership cards must be presented in the ring to receive the medal and/or the qualification.

28. SOUTH WEST PONY ASSOCIATION RULES

This show is a qualifier for the South West Pony Association Championships to be held on 31 August – 2 September 2023 at The David Broome Event Centre, Crick, Monmouthshire. NP26 5XP To qualify for the Championships: SWPA Members Enter one of the qualifying classes. Be either first or second in the class, and get your card signed. Take a picture of the card and upload via www.showingscene.com Non SWPA Members Enter one of the qualifying classes. Register on-line at www.showingscene.com within 14 days of qualification Send an Email to RichardatSWPA@aol.com advising of the show you attended, the class entered, and the position gained. You will be sent Qualifying Cards for the Horses / Ponies registered. Please Note: Registration fee for 2022/3 is £20 to include all members of the family and equines owned by the family. This will increase to £25 after 31 January 2023
